

Trump picks Judge Brett Kavanaugh as Supreme Court nominee

WASHINGTON (CNS)

— President Donald Trump announced July 9 that his nominee for the Supreme Court is Judge Brett Kavanaugh, a federal appeals court judge in Washington and a Catholic who once clerked for retiring Justice Anthony Kennedy.

"I am grateful to you and I am humbled by your confidence in me," said Kavanaugh, who was standing near his wife and two daughters.

Kavanaugh spoke about his Catholic faith, saying he tries to live by the motto instilled in him by his Jesuit high school: "be men for others." Kavanaugh, like Justice Neil Gorsuch, attended Georgetown Prep, a Jesuit boys school in Maryland. He also pointed out that his former pastor, Msgr. John Enzler, was in the audience. He said he used to be an altar boy for him and now the two serve the homeless together. The priest is the president and CEO of Catholic Charities of Washington. Kavanaugh also gave a shoutout to the girls basketball team at his parish which he coaches. He said the team has nicknamed him "Coach K."

He also told the group gathered in the East Room of the White House that he is "part of the vibrant Catholic community in the D.C. area," and added that

"members of that community disagree about many things, but we are united in our commitment to serve."

Kavanaugh said if he is chosen to be on the Supreme Court, he would "keep an open mind in every case" and "always strive to preserve the Constitution of the United States and the American rule of law."

Immediately after Justice Anthony Kennedy announced his retirement June 27, Trump said he would move quickly to nominate a replacement, saying he would review a list of candidates from the list he had to fill the seat now held by Gorsuch after the death of Justice Antonin Scalia.

Kennedy is one of five

Catholic justices on the Supreme Court along with Chief Justice John Roberts and Justices Clarence Thomas, Samuel Alito and Sonia Sotomayor.

Kavanaugh, 53, is a Yale Law School graduate who currently serves on the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit, where he has authored more than 280 opinions. He was part of the Independent Counsel Kenneth Starr's Whitewater investigation, which ultimately led to President Bill Clinton's impeachment by the House and acquittal by the Senate.

His biography on the court website notes that he is a regular lector at his church, the Shrine of the Most Blessed Sacrament in Washington. He also volunteers for the St. Maria's Meals program at Catholic Charities, has coached CYO, tutors at the Washington Jesuit Academy and belongs to the John Carroll Society, a group of Catholic lawyers and professionals.

Kavanaugh dissented from a majority decision of the D.C. Circuit that rejected a request from the Archdiocese of Washington and Priests for Life to have the full court review their challenge to the Affordable Care Act's contraceptive mandate.

He said that "the regulations substantially burden the religious organizations' exercise of religion because the regulations require the organizations to take an action contrary to their sincere religious beliefs." But he also wrote that the government "has a compelling interest in facilitating access to contraception for the employees of these religious organizations" and should "achieve it in other ways."

The nominee must be confirmed by the Senate in order to have a seat on the Supreme Court. The Senate Judiciary Committee will hold hearings questioning the nominee and if the committee approves, a vote for or against the nominee goes to the full Senate floor and must be approved with a simple majority or 51 votes.

Shreveport's Bishop Duca appointed bishop of Baton Rouge

The next bishop of Baton Rouge told members of his future flock Tuesday that they must recognize the oneness of the church, emphasizing — in Spanish — that all members are welcome and should learn more about each other's personal stories and struggles.

The Vatican announced June 26 that Pope Francis wanted Bishop Michael Gerard Duca of Shreveport to be the sixth leader of the Diocese of Baton Rouge. Duca, 66, will replace Bishop Robert Muench, who has been the spiritual leader for the area's

227,000 Roman Catholics since 2002.

In accordance with church law, Muench submitted his resignation to the Vatican when he turned 75 late last year. Duca's installation is set for Aug. 24 at St. Joseph Cathedral in Baton Rouge.

As a gesture to those who don't speak English, the Dallas native delivered a message in Spanish and said he wished he could have also delivered it in Vietnamese. He then translated for the English-speaking andience.

"I want them to know that they are part of our family," Duca said, "We are one church. And I can say that openly because I know that Baton Rouge is a city of much diversity. When I moved to Louisiana, I thought I would have shrimp and seafood in my freezer more than I could eat. And I moved to Shreveport, Louisiana, and I ended up with meat pies and tamales."

Duca said he will need to spend time to learn Baton Rouge culture, though he said he already understood its sense of hospitality, love of family and appreciation of food. A parishioner in his native Dallas introduced him to Louisiana cuisine, he said, but there is more to learn.

"That's one thing about the church, even though there may be a great difference in culture, there is one church language, the language of Mass, the language of sacraments, the language of prayer," Duca said. "The rest is lagniappe that I'll have to learn along the way."

Duca teared up as he addressed a room full of priests, lay ministers, reporters and others about the "goodness of the people of God" and the call to come to Baton Rouge. Papal nuncio Christophe Pierre — the pope's representative in the United States — asked him a couple weeks ago to become the bishop of Baton Rouge.


Duca said he did not know why he was chosen for the role. He said he has often been puzzled by his pastoral appointments during his 40 years as a priest, yet he has found joy and blessings in each of them. And he said he accepted the role as bishop of Baton Rouge with no reservations.

Duca was ordained a priest

in Dallas in 1978 after studying at Holy Trinity Seminary there and he later received a license in canon law from the University of St. Thomas Angelicum in Rome. He served as a priest at multiple churches in Dallas, the vocations director for the diocese there and then rector of Holy Trinity seminary.

Among the challenges before him are a priest shortage that has led to some parish closures and mergers in recent years, along with a changing face of Catholicism in Baton Rouge. He referenced his experience working with those discerning calls to the priesthood and religious life. He said he hopes to increase vocations to the priesthood in Baton Rouge while also maximizing "the talent that you have."

Duca's installation Mass is scheduled for 2 p.m. Aug. 24 at St. Joseph's Cathedral, at which time Muench will become bishop emeritus. The outgoing bishop said Tuesday he will serve in whatever capacity that Duca asks of him.

Moving again and the lessons offered

When I came to Alexandria, in September of 2016, just before the announcement of my appointment here, I was welcomed to our Diocese by three of our priests, Fathers Scott Chemino, Bruce Miller and Jim Ferguson. My first meeting with Bishop Herzog was arranged by Fr. Miller. At that initial meeting, it was decided that Bishop Herzog would remain at the house we call the "Bishop's Residence" and I would take up residence at the rectory of our Cathedral. I moved into the Cathedral rectory in late October 2016, and from the beginning, Fr. Jim Ferguson and the rectory staff have been like family. When Fr. Bill Gearheard took up residence with us, it enhanced what was already a happy house. But this will change in early August. I'm moving again.

In early August, I will move into the Bishop's Residence. It

is a beautiful home, given to the Diocese by Hugh and Anne Coughlin. Father Craig Scott is assisting us in arranging for some needed work on the house. Father Louis Sklar, who has lived at the Residence for a time, is assisting Bishop Emeritus Herzog in moving the last of his personal things to his new home at Regency House. A group of men and women that are part of the A.C.T.S. renewal/retreat ministry have volunteered to move all my stuff from the Cathedral rectory to the Bishop's Residence, saving the Diocese lots of dollars. And, to prepare for this early August move, Deacon Richard Mitchell and his family and a few friends will assist me in packing up all I own...which is mostly books... for this change of residence.

I know that most of you reading this column have moved before, and have experienced the lessons available to us when we have to pack up and move: of all our stuff, what do we really use? In packing up all of our clothes,

how much is too much? Could others wear what I never wear? Could others use what I never use? How many pots do I really need? Having to pack up all you own allows you to take stock, and ask those important questions that every disciple of the Lord Jesus should ask, about ownership and stewardship and the care of those who go without. Jesus of Nazareth talks about storing up stuff and sharing with others and the one great gift (c.f. Luke 12.16-34).

It is hard to believe but since my ordination as a Roman Catholic priest (in 1989), I have moved thirteen times. With this fourteenth move in early August, I should have one more move in me...retirement (way down the road)...or to be with the Lord (as He sees fit). I am so grateful to those that are assisting me with this change of residence. The kindness of friends...the love of the brothers and sisters in the Lord...the goodness of our people...these gifts give me such hope for our future as a Diocese...as we proclaim the Good News of the Risen Lord ... as we live abundantly, as branches connected to the Vine of Life...

Prayers and Postures during Ordination

This issue of the Church Today includes many pictures of the most recent ordinations in May and June. What a blessing it is for our diocese to have one new priest and nine new permanent deacons in active ministry doing the work of spreading the Good News of Jesus. These pictures capture the fact that the liturgy throughout an ordination is filled with beautiful postures and prayers which contain rich meaning that is often overlooked as we become caught up in the moment or due to us simply asking the question: "Why do we ...?"

The most common question regarding an ordination is: "Why do the men being ordained lay on the floor during the ceremony?" To fully understand and appreciate this posture, it is important to take a small step back in the liturgy. Before the elect prostrate themselves (lay face down on the floor), they are asked a series of questions to ensure they intend to uphold the office for which they are going to be ordained (priesthood or diaconate). While the elect make these promises, they also understand they are not worthy of this calling to ordination and will need all the graces and prayers possible to fulfill these promises.

So as a sign of their unworthiness, the elect prostrate themselves while we invoke the intercessions of the Saints to pray for them and indeed to pray for us all. Having been on that floor completely surrendering myself to the Lord, I can attest that this posture is the most vulnerable and defenseless position one can take; yet is very moving because it is here that one must rely on God for protection and can hear the support of the people's prayers as we sing the Litany of Saints.

Another question I hear after a priesthood ordination is: "What is the significance of putting oil on the hands of the new priest?" Using holy oils during a liturgy is not that uncommon. At a baptism, holy oils are typically used to anoint the baby; Sacred Chrism is used during confirmation, and holy oil is used during the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick; so the use of holy oils is a familiar sight to us. However, the significance of the Bishop using Sacred Chrism (consecrated oil) during the ordination is to anoint those hands that are now most important to us. For it is those hands that will now be the instruments used in the sacrament of Eucharist; those hands that will anoint us and our families when we are sick, baptize our children, and bless us in the sacrament of reconciliation and in times of need...those are more than just hands, but are indeed anointed hands used to do God's work.

Please continue to pray for your priests and deacons that they may always have the strength to fulfil their promises made at their ordination in doing the good work of the Lord.

She graduated from Providence Academy in 1944, became a beautician and owned and operated the Alexandria Beauty Shop for five years. Her work began as a teacher but after ten






