## Vatican condemns violence at Trump rally, offers prayers for victims, peace

VATICAN CITY (CNS) -- The Vatican expressed its concern about the violence waged at a political rally in the United States and it offered its prayers for the nation, the victims and peace.

In response to queries about the shootings at a rally involving former U.S. President Donald Trump in Pennsylvania, the Vatican press office released a statement July 14 expressing its “concern about last night’s episode of violence, which wounds people and democracy, causing suffering and death.”

The Holy See is “united in the prayer of the U.S. bishops for America, for the victims, and for peace in the country, so that the motives of the violent may never prevail,” the statement said in Italian.

Gunshots were fired at a Trump rally in Butler, Pennsylvania, July 13, injuring Trump who said on social media that a bullet “pierced” his right ear. One person attending the rally was killed and two others were critically injured, The Associated Press reported July 14.

The U.S. Secret Service said it killed the suspected shooter who had attacked from an elevated position outside the rally venue.

Law enforcement was investigating the shooting as an

attempted assassination of the former president and presumptive Republican presidential candidate, AP reported.

### U.S. Bishops' President Condemns Political Violence and Calls for Prayers for Peace

Archbishop Timothy P. Broglio of the U.S. Archdiocese for the Military Services, the president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, said in a written

statement July 13, “Together with my brother bishops, we condemn political violence, and we offer our prayers for President Trump, and those who were killed or injured.”

“We also pray for our country and for an end to political violence, which is never a solution to political disagreements. We ask all people of goodwill to join us in praying for peace in our country. Mary, Mother of God and Patroness of the Americas, pray for us,” the archbishop said.

## Trump names Vance, Ohio’s Catholic senator, as his 2024 running mate

WASHINGTON (OSV News) — Former President Donald Trump on July 15 named Ohio Sen. J.D. Vance, a Catholic, as his running mate on the Republican ticket in November.

Trump was widely expected to name his running mate at the Republican National Convention, which began the same day.

“After lengthy deliberation and thought, and considering the tremendous talents of many others, I have decided that the person best suited to assume the position of Vice President of the United States is Senator J.D. Vance of the Great State of Ohio,” Trump wrote in a post on his social media platform Truth Social. “J.D. honorably served our Country in the Marine Corps, graduated from Ohio State University in two years, Summa

Cum Laude, and is a Yale Law School Graduate, where he was Editor of The Yale Law Journal, and President of the Yale Law Veterans Association.”

Vance, author of “Hillbilly Elegy,” was elected to the U.S. Senate in 2022 after a contentious primary election in the Buckeye State, in which he got Trump’s endorsement. Vance, who is Catholic, is married to Usha Vance, a litigator. The couple has three young children.

Trump said Vance “will be strongly focused on the people he fought so brilliantly for, the American Workers and Farmers in Pennsylvania, Michigan, Wisconsin, Ohio, Minnesota, and far beyond.”

If elected, Vance would be just the second Catholic to serve as vice president in U.S. history.

# Pope recognizes miracle for church's first 'millennial' saint

VATICAN CITY (CNS) -- Pope Francis formally recognized a miracle attributed to the intercession of Blessed Carlo Acutis, a 15-year-old Italian teenager whose birth in 1991 will make him the first "millennial" to become a saint.

In a meeting May 23 with Cardinal Marcello Semeraro, prefect of the Dicastery for Saints' Causes, the pope signed decrees advancing the sainthood causes of Blessed Acutis, as well as one woman, and six men.

The Vatican announced May 23 that the pope had signed the decrees and that he would convene a consistory to set a date for the canonization of Acutis and other future saints: Blesseds Giuseppe Allamano; Marie-Léonie Paradis of Québec, Canada; Elena Guerra; and eight Franciscan friars and three Maronite laymen who were martyred in Damascus, Syria, in 1860.

Blessed Acutis was born and baptized in London to Italian parents in 1991, but the family moved back to Milan, Italy, while he was still an infant.

After he started high school, he began to curate, create or design websites, including one for a local parish, for his Jesuit-run high school and for the Pontifical Academy "Cultorum Martyrum," according to the saints' dicastery. He also used his computer skills to create an online database of Eucharistic miracles around the world.

He volunteered at a church-run soup kitchen, helped the poor in his neighborhood, assisted children struggling with their homework, played saxophone,

soccer and videogames, and loved making videos with his dogs and cats, according to carloacutis.com, the website dedicated to his cause for canonization.

"To always be close to Jesus, that's my life plan," he wrote when he was 7 years old.

He was devoted to Our Lady, praying the rosary every day, and to the Eucharist.

"The Eucharist is the highway to heaven," he wrote. When people sit in the sun, they become tan, "but when they sit before Eucharistic Jesus, they become saints."

When he was only 15, he was diagnosed with an aggressive form of leukemia and died Oct. 12, 2006. He had said, "I'm happy

to die because I've lived my life without wasting even a minute of it doing things that wouldn't have pleased God," according to carloacutis.com.

His mortal remains were moved to the municipal cemetery in Assisi in 2007 to fulfill his wish to be in the city of St. Francis. Then his remains were moved to the Shrine of the Renunciation at the Church of St. Mary Major in Assisi in 2019. He was buried wearing Nike sneakers, black jeans and an athletic warmup jacket -- clothes he was used to wearing every day.

In February 2020, the pope formally recognized a miracle attributed to Acutis' intercession

and in October that year, the teen was beatified during a Mass at the Basilica of St. Francis. An estimated 117,000 pilgrims visited the teen's tomb in just the first year after his beatification, the Diocese of Assisi said the day before his feast day, Oct. 12, 2021.

The two miracles attributed to the intercession of the teen involved alleged miraculous recoveries for a young boy in Brazil in 2013 and a young woman in Florence in 2022.

The miracle Pope Francis recognized May 23 that paves the way for the blessed's canonization involved a young woman who was born in Costa Rica in 2001 and moved to Florence in 2018 to study.

The woman fell from her bicycle at 4 a.m. July 2, 2022, and suffered a serious head injury, according to the dicastery website. Even after emergency surgery removing part of her skull to reduce severe intracranial pressure, doctors warned her family she could die at any moment.

An associate of the young woman's mother began praying to Blessed Acutis the same day, and the mother went to Assisi and prayed at the blessed's tomb July 8 -- the same day the young woman began to breathe on her own again. She slowly recovered basic mobility and a CT scan showed the hemorrhage was gone. After a period of rehabilitation therapy and a complete recovery, she and her mother visited his tomb Sept. 2.

Pope Francis has urged young people to learn about Blessed Acutis, who "did a great deal of good things," despite his short life.

"Above all, he was impassioned by Jesus; and since he was very good at getting around on the internet, he used it in the service of the Gospel, spreading love for prayer, the witness of faith and charity toward others," the pope told young Italians Jan. 29.

"Prayer, witness and charity" were the hallmarks of Blessed Acutis' life and should be a key part of the life of every Christian, he said.

# Diocese to offer marriage preparation classes

Congratulations on your engagement!

Preparing for your wedding day can be a momentous task. Securing the church and celebrant, finding the perfect dress or suit, the accompanying attire for the wedding party, picking the reception venue and caterer to finding a photographer who will capture those special moments that you can relive for ages to come. All the particulars that go with planning this special day are both tedious and at times can be overwhelming and stressful. Your wedding day is a special moment in your life but please realize it is also a special day in the life of the church.

Pope Benedict carefully reflected on the decision to marry as something more than the act of falling in love: "The emotion of love must be purified. It must undertake a journey of discernment in which the mind and the will also come into play.... In the rite of Marriage, the Church does not ask whether you are in love but whether you want, whether you are resolved. In other words, falling in love must become true love; it must involve the will and the mind in a journey (which is the period of engagement) of purification,



of greater profundity so that it is truly all of man, with all his capacities, with the discernment of reason and the force of will, who says: 'Yes, this is my life'."

In preparation for marriage, a couple must look at the sacramental component of marriage and not simply the wedding day. The Catholic Church understands marriage to be a life-long commitment. As a couple lives their marriage vocation out, they will experience "joys and hopes and sorrows and anxieties." (Gaudium et spes 1.) These experiences are not isolated in the couple's relationship, but

with their fellow Christians as well.

Secular society says the period of your engagement is a time of preparing every detail of your wedding day and to a large extent, the honeymoon. But the Church encourages couples to use this time to prepare for a life-long marriage. The engagement period is a time in which you should take time to deepen your faith, both personally and interpersonal spirituality.

As you prepare to offer yourself as a sign of God's grace in the world, the Diocese of Alexandria is here to help

guide you through this period of preparation. Beginning Oct. 12, marriage preparation workshops are returning to the Diocese of Alexandria. Having been offered at the parish level for some years, these one-day workshops will be hosted at the St. Joseph Catholic Center at 4400 Coliseum Blvd in Alexandria. Designed to engage couples preparing for a life-long marriage, the workshop will cover topics that are critical for couples to discuss and reflect upon. ## This summer, take kids deeper in faith

Our family values often drive our summer bucket list. We may value education, shared experiences, athletic and skill development. These are all great things, but the greater thing is “the living and enduring word of God” (1 Pet. 1:23).

Just as we prepare nutritious meals to sustain and grow our kids, we should also plan for their spiritual nourishment. By summer’s end, we want them taller and deeper, smarter and wiser. If they feast on the “solid food” of the word this summer, Lord willing, they’ll grow deeper in spiritual maturity (1 Cor. 3:2). Memorizing scripture on road trips, learning the “Fruit of the Spirit” (Gal. 5:22–23) on picnics, or honing in on one passage for our summer theme are all doable, yet depth producing.

“Depth” in the child-rearing years may seem elusive. But, mommas, take heart—depth and dishes are not mutually exclusive. See, spiritual depth isn’t about staying up on current events, engaging in drawn out discussions, or even being intellectual. Spiritual depth is about a faith that runs deep.

This summer, imagine if we added “go deeper” to the top of our summer bucket list and intentionally planned ways to guide our children toward a deeper walk with Christ. How might our families grow in spiritual depth this summer?

### Deeper in Prayer

At the end of every family dinner, the voices of our preschool grandchildren unite in a familiar



request: “Let’s wrestle!” But, there’s another form of wrestling we ache for them to learn—an ever-increasing practice of wrestling in prayer. Paul describes Epaphras as “always wrestling for you in his prayers, so that you can stand mature and fully assured in everything God wills” (Col. 4:12, italics mine).

If we want our kids to be Epaphras pray-ers, always wrestling in prayer, summertime affords excellent “practice” opportunities. There are lots of ways we can lead our kids to grow deeper in prayer this summer. We might design our own family prayer calendar where we pray for pre-determined people or things each day or week. We can take prayer walks, praying out-loud together, thanking God for his creation, and praying for each other and our neighbors. We can walk around our church building on a summer night and

pray for our church. Consider creating a summer prayer journal or chalkboard where both prayers and answers are recorded. Or, enjoy weekly family campfires where each person prays for the person on their left.

### Deeper in Service

Authentic depth is not only inward, it also looks outward and points others to the love of God. In 2 Timothy 3:16–17 we’re reminded that “all Scripture is inspired by God and is profitable for teaching, for rebuking, for correcting, for training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work” (italics mine). Spiritual depth is a “so-that” depth. As our family grows deeper, so should our service.

Summertime can lend itself to an inward family focus as we strive to complete our bucket list. To maintain an outward and others-focused mindset, we might

hold a family brainstorming session about ways to serve this summer, and—to tie spiritual growth together—we can pray for God to guide us to specific opportunities.

Consider making a meal or baking cookies for someone who had surgery, helping with yard work for someone who is elderly or widowed, creating cards or letters for someone who is homebound or grieving, or checking with local organizations about service opportunities that are suitable for kids. Options abound for guiding our kids toward loving their neighbor with a “so-that” depth.[1]

### Deeper in Love

As moms, we pour out love


in overseeing our kids’ spiritual growth while simultaneously seeking to grow deeper ourselves. It’s encouraging to remember that we, too, have an overseer—Christ is the “Overseer of your souls” (1 Pet. 2:25). When we submerge ourselves in the depths of the One who oversees our soul, we will instinctively lead our children closer to the Overseer of their souls. For a short time, we can oversee multiple facets of our kids’ lives, and so we should. But, only God can oversee their souls. Mommas can rest easier in a restless world when we spend time with our Lord and are “able to comprehend with all the saints what is the length and width, height and depth of God’s love” for us and our children (Eph. 3:18).

Deep living requires intention, strategy, and patience. But, it’s worth employing every bit of our God-enabled, mom-creativity into guiding our children to a deeper walk with Christ. This summer and beyond, may our families transition to deeper waters where our faith grows and beckons others to join us.

## Religious education assessment an ongoing process

The Diocese of Alexandria's Office of Catholic Schools along with the Office of Religious Education, has partnered with ARK (Assessment of Religious Knowledge) for the last two years in evaluating the religious education of our students. The goal of the assessment is to help us identify our strengths and weaknesses in building the

over 275,000 Catholic school students/faculty taking part in the assessment. The Diocese of Alexandria had over 2000 students and over 200 faculty participate in this year's testing period, March through May.

The data gained from annual ARK tests are a valuable source for religion teachers and directors and coordinators of



Catholic faith in our children.

ARK is the only comprehensive online assessment of Catholic Religious Education to date that assesses religious knowledge in students from 2nd to 12th grade, both in our Catholic schools and in parish religious education settings.

During the first half of 2024, ARK was administered in eighty-four Dioceses nationwide with

religious education programs in developing their teaching tools for the upcoming school year and for years to come.

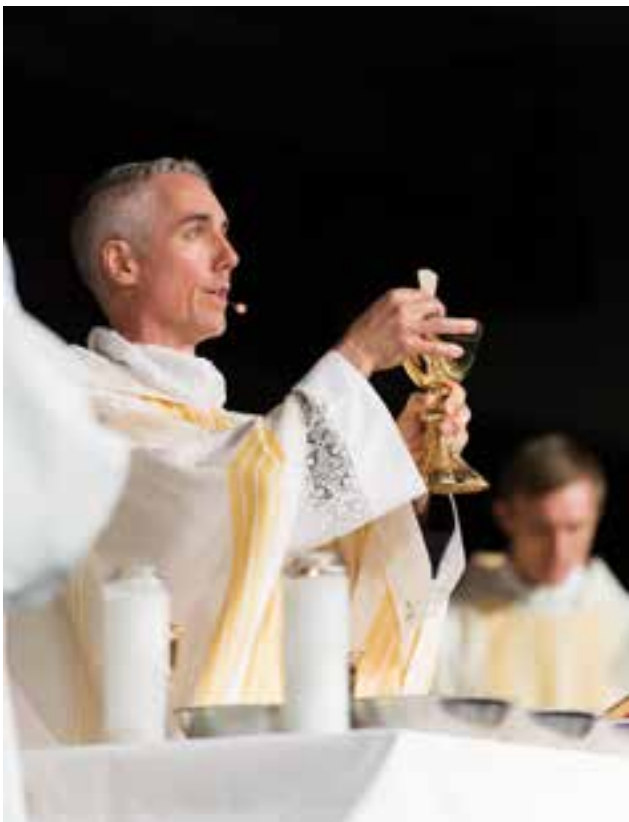

# Catholic Charities offers support: Breathing through Grief

Catholic Charities of Central Louisiana (CCCLA) supports the Diocese of Alexandria in bearing “witness to the charity of Jesus Christ, in both work and deed” by serving as the arm of social welfare through the many and diverse services offered. Disaster relief has recently been highlighted as Central Louisiana prepares for the immediacy of summer related events caused by hurricanes, wildfires, and related calamities of nature. “Basic Needs” support is foundational to assistance provided by CCCLA, as there are perpetually families and individuals in the Central Louisiana community who find themselves in unexpected financial situations and require aid for fundamental necessities

and education to strengthen future responses to setbacks.

“Mental Health” is the third, but certainly not last nor least, in the trifecta of equally weighted services. CCCLA offers counseling, Christian life coaching, vaping and tobacco cessation as well as support groups. In response to an expressed need for a community to process grief, CCCLA is offering a seven-week program that will provide a unity of support kinship that encourages growth and forward motion. The experience of “grief” conjures many different thoughts. The most common is related to the bereavement of a loved one through death. However, loss within the context of divorce, empty-nest, illness, job loss, and even pet loss evokes grieving emotions and responses.

Beginning Aug. 13, CCCLA certified Christian Life Coaches

will lead a grief support program developed by Pat Sheveland, the founder of The International Academy of Grief (IAFC), the B.R.E.A.T.H.E Coaching Model for Grief. The steps are designed with actions that will meet the recipient in their grief journey regardless of the circumstance.

# National Tekakwitha Conference draws Native Americans to North Carolina

RALEIGH, N.C. (OSV News) — The Tekakwitha Conference “is the world’s largest gathering of Catholic, Native Americans,” said Jody Roy of Chicago, who was in Raleigh to attend the 85th annual conference.

“We represent more than 500 different tribes in the United States. Here, we share how we integrate our traditional culture with Catholic faith,” she told NC Catholics, the magazine of the Diocese of Raleigh.

Roy, who attended her first Tekakwitha Conference in 2005, was among people from states such as South Dakota, New Mexico, Colorado, New York and Louisiana who gathered July 3–7 at the Raleigh Marriott City Center for the 2024 conference

The conference offered attendees sunrise services, a trip to Fourth of July fireworks at nearby Dix Park and sacraments such as reconciliation.

It also presented an opportunity to focus on the life of St. Kateri Tekakwitha, known as Lily of the Mohawks. She was born in 1656 in an area known today as Auriesville, New York. The first North American, Indigenous saint in the church,

she was canonized in 2012.

Among the speakers was Deacon Larry Deschaine of the Diocese of Charleston, South Carolina, a descendant of multiple tribes, who discussed the Truth & Reconciliation Meditation Garden at Mepkin Abbey, the Trappist monastery in Moncks Corner, South Carolina. The garden is described as “an opportunity for visitors of different views and backgrounds to reflect on our shared past, shared pain and shared desire for reconciliation.”

Julienne Montour, a Mohawk from Michigan, spoke about boarding school healing. Between 1819 and 1969, there were more than 523 government-funded, and often church-run, boarding schools across the U.S. that separated Native children from their families, depriving them of their languages, cultures and identities to forcibly assimilate them into the dominant white culture.

Workshops included Native inculturation of the Roman liturgy, which was led by Father Michael Carson, assistant director for Native American Affairs at the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops

Four bishops and 12 priests and deacons joined attendees in the celebration of Mass July 5. Bishop Chad W. Zielinski of

New Ulm, Minnesota, chairman of the USCCB’s Subcommittee on Native American Affairs, was present, as were Bishop Jaime Soto of Sacramento, California, Bishop Ramon Bejarano of San Diego and Bishop Luis R. Zarama of Raleigh.

Bishop Zarama encouraged those gathered to share their time with Jesus, believe in the transformative power of love and to be examples of living faith.

Prayers of the faithful included intentions for those who feel isolated or bullied because of their heritage as well as prayers for harmony and the canonization of the Florida martyrs.

During Mass, three beats of a hand drum marked the moment just before consecration. In addition to the drum, musicians playing a keyboard and a Native American flute made of rosewood added to the celebration.

Father David Miller, chaplain to the Native American Catholic community in the Raleigh Diocese, said the annual gathering is an important event for faith, culture and awareness and is for all “friends,” Native American and non-Native American.

It’s ecumenical in nature, like a Kateri Circle, is welcoming and seeks to bring cultures together for understanding, the priest added.

According to the Tekakwitha Conference organization, based in Alexandria, Louisiana, a Kateri Circle is a group of

faithful Catholics, non-Catholic Christians “and/or seekers who desire to be in community with one another through a lifestyle of prayer, service and worship.”

Father Miller, who is pastor of St. Mildred Parish in Swansboro, North Carolina, was ordained in Raleigh in 2019. Originally from Oklahoma, he’s a citizen of the Cherokee Nation.

During their spring general assembly in June, the U.S. bishops approved a new pastoral plan for Indigenous Catholics, “Keeping Christ’s Sacred Promise: A Pastoral Framework for Indigenous Ministry.” The 56-page text was developed by

the USCCB’s Committee on Cultural Diversity in the Church and its Subcommittee on Native American Affairs.

Along with acknowledging and apologizing for the church’s role in decimating Indigenous cultures in the U.S. — particularly through the boarding school system — the five-part plan focuses on calls for healing, mission, reconciliation, holiness and transformation in ministry to the nation’s Indigenous Catholics, whose “journey ... in the United States of America has been marked by moments of great joy but also of profound sorrow,” the document states. “Through this pastoral framework, we ... hope to begin anew a journey of mutual accompaniment with the Catholic Indigenous Peoples of these lands,” states the document.

# Blessed Chats: Single women and prayer

I sat somewhat uncomfortably beneath the shade of tall pine trees, a gentle wind rustling the canopy and my hair. My journal rested in my lap. I was on a leadership retreat in high school, just learning that I could have a personal relationship with God in prayer. I fidgeted on the cold, hard ground and leaned in hard to hear Him.

Like a pen pal catching up with a beloved friend after months of missing each other, I poured out my heart in those pages. My monologue of fears and failures, dreams and desires spilled over from one page to the next. But one question, one hope, dominated the landscape of my heart and the contents of that letter: my vocation.

### A Longing

I longed for romantic love, and was preoccupied with it. In every elementary school class I had a crush. Next I fell deeply in love with my junior high best friend. And in between classes as I walked my high school campus, my eyes and heart were always searching for someone. The one.

I always imagined having a love that spanned my whole life, so I was eager to get started. After sharing my perfect plan for a Perfect Marriage™, I put the question to Him. Would He send me this man?

And for the first time, I heard the Voice of the Lord in prayer. One clear, pure word settled in my heart: wait.

Looking back, I still marvel at the peace I felt in the moment. I wasn't dejected or discouraged, instead I was elated that the Lord listened to my prayer and responded. Waiting didn't have a terrible, long-suffering connotation. I felt no fear or resentment. In fact, as I made my way back to the hall for our next session, my steps were lighter. God heard me, He loved me, and He wanted the best for me. After all, I reckoned, 17 is still young.

Years ticked past and my hopes continued, deferred. The boys I liked never invited me to a dance. My not-so-secret college crush never asked me on a proper date. There was no post-grad office romance, especially since



the only man I worked with as youth minister at my new parish was the priest.

But still, I prayed. I hoped. And contrary to Padre Pio's sage advice, I worried.

### Peace in Eucharistic Adoration

Having encountered Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament on another high school retreat, I sought Him out in Eucharistic Adoration. In those early years of ministry, I cried to Him on lonely Friday nights and pre-gamed with Him

before youth group every Sunday. I stopped in when I was having a bad day and needed a Friend. The chapel became my safe place, my second home. In it, I filled many more journals recording conversations with the One I had come to know so well.

Spring, summer, fall, and winter, morning, noon, and night, I visited Him. Even when I was angry at God about my self-imposed vocation deadlines, I showed up. When I felt unseen, I punched in the little code and

sat down before His Eucharistic face. When there was no one and nothing, when there was and then there wasn't, when my heart broke and I thought I messed it all

up, I cried and raged and finally, blessedly, came back to peace in that still, small chapel.

### Keep Showing Up

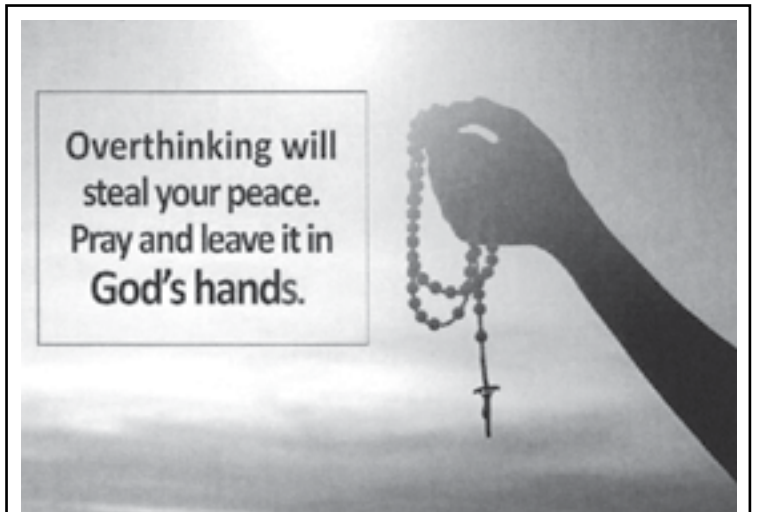
This devotion to Jesus in the Eucharist changed my life. Like the sinful woman in Luke 8, I daily poured out my heart at His feet. In His True Presence, He purified and rightly-ordered my desires, restored my dignity, and revealed the Love I was longing for.

I've spent the last twenty years kneeling before Him in dozens of similar chapels, and still my hope for my vocation has not yet been realized. Still I wait. But in those twenty years, I have been deeply loved. The Lover of my soul pursued my heart and called me Beloved and told me again and again how beautiful I am to Him (Song of Songs 4:1).

# How to help teens become fully alive in Christ

Greetings from Steubenville, Ohio! My name is Brian Kissinger, and I work for Franciscan University of Steubenville, where I serve as executive director of conferences. I grew up in Steubenville, but before moving back to my hometown, I spent 11 years in parish youth ministry and, more recently, lived in Austria, where I worked for Franciscan's study abroad program.

As a parish youth minister, I was always trying to come up with better flyers, social media posts, icebreaker games, and event topics to pull in more teenagers to our events. Then I realized that, once they came, we also needed catchy titles for talks, thought-provoking small group questions, and unforgettable snacks to keep them coming back the following week.

## **The Key Ingredient to Youth Ministry**

Although I still think some of my Instagram posts were cultural masterpieces—and I'll never forget how cool it was to make a life-sized Angry Birds game (circa 2010) using cardboard boxes and massive balloon launchers—in hindsight, there's no doubt the most effective and

impactful part of our parish's youth ministry program was the simplest part. We kept things personal.

We knew we couldn't compete with the entertainment everyone had access to via their phones, but we could accompany young people on their journey of faith and offer personal encouragement and support. Most importantly, we could provide the opportunity for young people to personally encounter Jesus through the sacramental life of the Church.

The concept of encountering Jesus can sound intimidating or abstract, but it doesn't have to be. We recognized that, all too often, we Catholics can forget the significance of the rituals and sacraments that Christ has given the Church. Our aim was simply to offer a place and a time where young people could step back from the noise, distractions, and busyness and turn their focus on Jesus present in the Eucharist. Of course, when we speak of the Eucharist, we mean both the Mass—the source and summit of the Christian life—and the Blessed Sacrament. I am going to focus here on Eucharistic adoration. When it comes to setting the stage for this encounter with Jesus, it wasn't a complicated formula:

Before any times of

Eucharistic adoration, we'd have a short talk reminding the congregants of both the Real Presence of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament as well as his desire to come close to us individually.

During the time of adoration, we'd invite everyone present to call to mind whatever was on their hearts and to silently and prayerfully offer it all to Jesus. Whether they were hopeful, anxious, excited, or fearful about those things, we reminded them that Jesus wants to hear from us.

We'd have times of both music and silence, recognizing that some people would love the silence while others would struggle with it.

## **The Longings of the Human Heart**

The young people from our parish weren't magically made immune to the problems in their daily lives. They still had struggles, questions, and doubts even after they prayed in front of the Eucharist. But we knew that only Jesus could satisfy the longings, hopes, and needs of the human heart. Only in meeting the person of Jesus do we find the peace and fulfillment we're all looking for. Young people who had gone through years of faith formation remarked that something changed when they realized that the God of the universe, in the Person of his incarnate Son, Jesus Christ, actually wanted to be close and known. We were privileged to

accompany several teenagers as they sought Baptism and then full initiation within the Church. The response from young people was powerful; their hearts were moved as they came to know the Father's love made visible in our Eucharistic Lord.

In *Evangelii Gaudium*, Pope Francis invites the faithful to a "renewed personal encounter with Jesus Christ." Although our age is unique in its ability to be more globally connected than ever before, we all still long for personal connection and real relationships.

## **Awaken: The Congress Youth Experience**

For the last 49 years, Franciscan University has offered Steubenville Conferences in the summer to invite both young people and adults to a renewed personal encounter with Jesus, in the power of the Holy Spirit, through the sacramental life of the Church. Both here on our campus in Steubenville and in collaboration with regional conference partners across the United States and in Canada, we've been privileged to provide this transformative retreat experience for over one million people.

While we've been blessed to work with incredibly talented speakers and musicians, we know the most important person involved in the Steubenville Conferences is Jesus Christ. Through reverent and inspiring liturgies, opportunities for the

Sacrament of Reconciliation, and times of Eucharistic adoration at every conference, we see faith renewed and hope restored. It's not a complicated formula; the music and talks prepare people to encounter Jesus, and then we get out of the way to let him do what only he can do.

As Catholic Christians, we believe that the same Lord who healed the sick and raised the dead 2,000 years ago is truly present in the Eucharist we receive at Mass and adore on the altar. More than simply help for the journey, the sacraments offer us a privileged opportunity to encounter Jesus. As Pope Benedict XVI reminds us, "Christianity is not an intellectual system, a collection of dogmas, or a moralism. Christianity is an encounter, a love story; it is an event."

We at Franciscan University of Steubenville are grateful that events like the National Eucharistic Congress help facilitate personal experiences of the revival, restoration, and renewal that Jesus Christ offers through his Church. We are honored to partner with the Congress to oversee the Youth Experience, Awaken, and trust that if we simply set the stage, Our Eucharistic Lord will do what only he can do: heal hearts and transform lives.
